SSP update: School data shows improvements in both Literacy and Math. 78% of students are meeting in reading, 70% meeting in writing. Staff are meeting regularly to discuss student progress and plans for supporting students who are not yet meeting. Math data for end of Term 2 77% of our ANS students are meeting (up 4%) 86% of our Indigenous students are meeting (same)	

83% of Primary students are meeting (down 1%)

88% of Grade 1 students are meeting (same)

81% of Grade 2 students are meeting (up 4%)

89% of Grade 3 students are meeting (same)

Well-being initiative has been very positive. Students easily filled the jar at the end of March. We have a domino display planned at the end of April as a reward.
